Mildenhall District

Worlington

The story of the Mildenhall and Lakenheath area starts in Worlington in the 1560s whence the Mortlocks seem to have radiated to Brandon. There are also early records for Long Barton, Little Barton and Barton Mills. However, see also the dynasty of blacksmiths that came into Freckenham, and later Worlington Manor Farm, from Hawstead. Further Mortlocks came into Brandon from Lakenheath, and also via a circuitous route, through Northamptonshire and Huntingdonshire, from Clare.

A tiny, primitive brass plate on one of the pillars of Worlington church records a 1620 Mortlock bequest to the parish of thirty shillings a year.

Much later, the unfortunate William, and his consort the even more unfortunate Lydia, exhibit more of those puzzling signs suggesting links, that we can no longer see, between different families of Mortlocks. It's the way he picks on existing Mortlock territory - Worlington and Soham - in different counties for his misadventures, when he has the whole of East Anglia to choose from (I have put his tree in the Cambridgeshire section).

The patriarch of the Mortlocks who migrated to Hull and Grimsby came from Worlington, but the parish register is silent as to his origins, as it is for the earlier (1806) James who migrated to Kensington; perhaps some nonconformity there. But when people in Hull or London pick on a village the size of Worlington for their place of origin, they have to be believed. Henry's heirs, most unusually for Mortlocks, took to the sea.

Freckenham

John and (?) his wife Frances left will in the Freckenham 'peculiar' in 1714 and 1722. John sealed his will with a seal of an anchor transfixing a heart. The seal on Frances' will is probably the same but is now too damaged to be read. John had a house 'by the bridge foot in Freckenham' and eleven acres of land in Badlingham, cosisting of unrelated plots of two acres or less. Nevertheless he felt able to leave his under-age daughters marriage portions of £30 or £40 each.

Apart from these early records, see also Hawstead for the origins of the later local Mortlock line.

Barton Mills

This is a rather disjointed story, due to paucity of records, and it is not clear whether the ultimate family here are direct descendants of those who left the earliest records. However the trail is strong from Robert, miller, born 1795 but he seems to have been in Mildenhall and Worlington before settling in Barton Mills, so may have been an incomer from Mildenhall. The Christian name of Ambrose which recurs in this table was an East Anglian surname marrying into the Mortlocks elsewhere in Suffolk; also as Ambrose (1610) Mortlock of Brinkley, Cambs, possible progenitor of the China Mortlocks. This may be an invisible and unprovable link between the two families, particularly considering the land in Brandon held by Ambrose' probable grandson John.

Lakenheath & Mildenhall

This is the main core of the Mortlocks for this area. Some Lakenheath Mortlocks settled later in Brandon, bringing that wheel full circle.

The Mildenhall Mortlocks seem to be descended from those of Lakenheath, as are those of Mundford, Norfolk (q.v.). Thomas born in Mildenhall in 1752 removed to Attleborough in Norfolk.

In 1895 [Manchester Times 17.5.95] Gertrude Mortlock, a domestic servant from 1888, sued her employers from 1893 (a Dr & Mrs Poole) over a bad reference. She won a farthing damages and no costs. This seems to be Gertrude Abigail (Mildenhall(2)), rescued by marriage and restored to East Anglia in 1896.

Mundford, Hilgay & West Rudham

The most prolific group of Mortlocks in Norfolk, originating from Mildenhall as above, radiated from Mundford to Hilgay and West Rudham, and onward to Methwold and to the Great Yarmouth area, and indeed also to Lancashire and Yorkshire. The progenitor of this sept is the William of Mildenhall, Suffolk, who was apprenticed to William Payne in Mundford for 7 years at age 16, "six years ago" spent 18 months in the militia [?1757-9?] [presumably after completing his apprenticeship in ?1756] (note dated 8.2.1765 [Bury St Edmunds CRO, EL 110/7/1-3]), which ties in with his Mildenhall baptism in 1733. His forebears came from Lakenheath. He seems to have gone back to live in Mundford some time between 1764 and 1770, after living in Mildenhall following his marriage there in 1756, an event which would also not have happened while he was still an apprentice. His Militia service may account for the first child not appearing until 1760).

There is a curiosity here where John of Mundford marries Alice Frost in Poslingford, Suffolk, in 1819. Poslingford is a "Mortlock" village and one does wonder if there is an undiscovered link between the Norfolk and other Mortlocks; but it may be just a coincidence; there are others. As it is John and Alice must have had to go on the parish when their baby was born and all three were then deported back to Mundford. The dates of the marriage and of Mary's baptism, not unusually, speak for themselves.

This Mundford root accounts for at least two-thirds of the available Norfolk Mortlock records; possibly some of the others are linked but this cannot easily be demonstrated - a challenge for a Norfolk Mortlock descendant.

By the end of the 19th century, these Mundford Mortlocks had radiated to Accrington and Stalybridge in Lancashire, to Leeds in Yorkshire, to Pimlico and Lambeth in London, and to Kent. There are eventual links to Canada and Australia, and connections with the United States.

One of the Australian links is from Robert Gent and his two Mary Ann Mortlock wives. In 1857, shortly after his second marriage - to a cousin of his first wife - he emigrated to Australia in the *Admiral Boxer*. The couple settled in Ballarat, where the four surviving children of his first marriage were joined by eight more from the second. All this has been documented by an Australian descendant of Robert and the first Mary Ann Mortlock, Mary Ann Cohn.

It will be seen that the Mundford branch of the Mortlocks had rather more than its fair share of

bereavements in the carnage of the First World War, especially Thomas Robert's loss of three sons. Thomas and Henry are remembered on memorials at St John's church, South Bank, and Frederick at St James' church, Walham Green.

See Mundford (13) et seq. for a criminal family of Mortlock counterfeiters.

Attleborough & Hingham

Another group from Mildenhall radiated from Attleborough to Hingham and on to Reymerston, and to various locations in London. The patriarch, Thomas, was born in 1752, in Mildenhall, Suffolk, was a descendant of the Mortlocks of Lakenheath.

The 'China' Mortlocks

The John who was the progenitor of the Mortlocks who ran a prestigious china and glass emporium in Oxford Street, London, and who died in Brinkley in 1697, had land in Brandon and Brandon Ferry; so I have put this group immediately after the Mildenhall group.

This John may be the John born in Brinkley in 1636, so I have interleaved a Brinkley Mortlock tree at this point.



William Kennedy was 5'8" when he attested in March 1915. He rose rapidly to sergeant. He served in France from June to December 1916 when he was brought home and commissioned into 13th County of London Princess Louise' Kensington Regiment. Wounded in the back at Arras on 9th April 1917, he was later blown up and had his head driven "with considerable force" against the corner of a mine shaft. The Army would not accept that either his later pituitary tumour, which cost him the sight of one eye and most of the sight of the other, or his enlarged heart, or his persistent indigestion, or his later asthma were due to his service. It is clear from his papers that by the twenties the Army brass in Whitehall regarded the damaged products of the War as rather a bore [TNA, WO374/49164]. While being treated, he lost the sight of one eye - not because the eye had been damaged physically, but because this somehow related to an injured pituitary gland (or thymus/thalamus?). He learned to do copper plate engravings while he was convalescing. Perhaps lenses and persistence made up the difference for his poor vision. He married a sister of a KG WAGSTAFF and settled in Sprotborough, 2'W of Doncaster. In Doncaster he may have served in the ARP, judging by the subject matter of some of his work. Some of his etchings were offered for sale in 2004; others and some of their plates are held by the family. They included views of Sprotborough and Wadworth (3'S of Doncaster) (1940) as well as of Doncaster itself (1940). He was written up in 1982 (WK Mortlock, His Life and Work, Peter Tuffrey, pub. William Mortlock Association, paperback).

His mother Kate Mortlock was also known as a painter in Doncaster (reverting to her Mortlock name after the death of her second husband). She seems to have been painting rural scenes in Cumbria in 1898 - as well as being the composer of fifty songs and light piano pieces.

Noel was a clerk living in Ealing, 5'7" and 128 lbs when he enlisted into a reserve "Graduate" battalion (52nd Beds) in 1916. He was in the ranks in the Norfolk Regiment in 1917 and was commissioned in July 1918, when his education was described as "very fair" as was his military knowledge and his power of command. However the Army by then was desperate for subalterns and it was in his favour as a "temporary gentleman" that he could ride. "Disembodied"[!] in 1918 he was promoted to Lieutenant on the reserve in 1920 and was allowed to retain his rank when he was fully discharged in 1921 [TNA,WO374/49162]. He went to work for the Northern Ireland Land Purchase Commission [LG 8.1.35]. In 1935 the Ministry of Health took him on as a clerk; in 1936 he was promoted Assistant Inspector of Insurance there. In the Second World War he joined up again and became an equipment officer in the RAF, being released as a Flight Lieutenant in August 1946.



'George' born '1820' in Walthamstow, 'smith', got 2 years for possessing counterfeit coins in Middlesex 1.1.1849, and may have been an otherwise undocumented brother of Benjamin and Simon although he eludes tracing either for baptism or via the census. More probably he might be Benjamin himself.

Benjamin 1818-1866, was sentenced to transportation in Middlesex 16.6.1851 for possessing a counterfeit coin mould. He was using the alias Alfred Walker. He was not however sent overseas, but to Wakefield gaol 18.7.51 and then Portsmouth 26.8.52. He was discharged on licence 18.6.55 c/o Mrs Charles Haddon SPURGEON of 2, Fair Place, Stepney, wife of a noted Christian evangelist and preacher. [Lloyd's Weekly, 29.7.1851, TNA, PCOM3, HO8 and various Googled biographical notes on the Rev. CH Spurgeon; obituary Bury Post, 5.6.1866]

Sarah was acquitted of possessing a coin mould 16.6.1851; given 3 mo. at the Old Bailey 15.9.1856; 4 mo. for uttering counterfeit coins 12.5.1857 (as 'MORTLAKE'); 6 mo. 'uttering' with Benjamin ('engine driver'), Newington 18.4.1859; & 12 mo. for uttering 28.11.1859 (as Sarah Jane).

Benjamin John, 1839-1904, was a chip off the old block and the only Mortlock to be found in custody in all the censuses of his adulthood. His curriculum vitae speaks for itself.

Following and a conviction and prison sentence in Surrey 18.4.1859, in 1865 Benjamin John was caught with fake dies for forging florins, shillings & sixpences at 3, Little Queen St, Camberwell 1865, as part of a London-wide gang of forgers. Also found were a quantity of counterfeit coins, two plaster of Paris moulds, files, a galvanic battery and a variety of opther implements. He was sentenced to 7 yrs penal servitude [Times, & Standard, 10.7.65].

In 1871 he was a 'convict' in Gillingham, Kent, following sentencing in Kent 11.7.70 (in spite of contriving an acquittal in Middlesex 25.10.1869). The Bristol Mercury, 3.2.82, reported that Benjamin and his wife (Louisa) Bridget, then of 5, Bell Cottages, Battersea, had been remanded (in Surrey) for coining. Four weeks later he was off for ten years' penal servitude, with two accomplices, Bridget being acquitted. She had already been acquitted once before on coining charges 9.7.66. See also Berrow's Worcester Journal, 4.2. & 11.2.1882, & Morning Post 1.3.82 & Standard 1.3.82, & North Wales Chronicle 4.3.82 - Benjamin was achieving national notoriety.

Back in circulation again, the 1891 census found Benjamin in police cells in Finsbury, he receiving another five years at the Old Bailey 12.9.1892 as his alter ego 'George Williams'.

Lloyd's Weekly News caught up with him 11.9.98 reporting another remand for coining, this time at Stangate Street Lambeth, caught red-handed with a new associate, the somewhat younger Edith Croft, Bridget having died in 1886. Edith had been living with 'little Ben' for fifteen months. He only received seven years hard labour this time; Edith got twelve months. He also received the accolade of being 'one of the most expert coiners in existence'. For this and more detail see also Illustrated Police News 17.9.98, & Royal Cornwall Gazette 22.9.98, & Standard 28.10.98 & Western Mail 28.10.98. In Dartmoor for the 1901 census he described himself as a 'crockery dealer'.

The whole story is lurid red-top stuff.
